History The development of AutoCAD began in the early 1970s, when engineer Martin Goodspeed left Sperry-Univac and joined the Sperry-Univac company after experiencing frustration from learning other computer-aided design applications that were slow, cumbersome, and required users to learn complex codes and commands. Before Sperry-Univac or other large companies even thought about computer-aided design, Goodspeed worked on a graphics editing system that produced and used a PostScript file to display vector graphics. Sperry-Univac filed for bankruptcy on May 8, 1982, and Autodesk, with backing from an American businessman named Louis Novick, acquired the rights to the application on November 16, 1982. Autodesk originally intended to license the application to other commercial software companies, but found that the software worked best on the then-new IBM PC, so they decided to create a standalone version for that platform. AutoCAD was first released to manufacturing customers in 1983, and in 1984 Autodesk changed the name of the application from Plotter to AutoCAD. In 1985, a revised version of AutoCAD 2.0 was released, and by the end of the year, Autodesk had sold 20,000 copies of AutoCAD. In 1987, a subsequent version, AutoCAD 3.0, was released, and it was the first version of AutoCAD for the IBM PC platform, and was the first version of AutoCAD to become available on a disk. AutoCAD 3.0 added the ability to create databases and to send drawing files via e-mail, and its new features included a 3D view that could be projected onto a three-dimensional (3D) model, and it could be used to convert 2D drawings to 3D views. 3D modeling tools were added in 1988, and the ability to create templates was added in 1989, and the ability to create animations in 1990. In 1991, AutoCAD 3.5 added the ability to create databases, and it was the first version of AutoCAD to support bitmap graphics. AutoCAD 3.5 was also the first version of AutoCAD to support Windows 3.0, and its release coincided with the arrival of Windows for Workgroups. AutoCAD 4.0 was released in September 1993, and it was the first version of AutoCAD to support 3D objects and 3D

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History On December 1, 2005, Autodesk launched a web-based application development tool, AutoCAD Web Application Framework, a web application programming interface (API) for developers to automate tasks in AutoCAD. It was renamed to Visual LISP in 2007 and discontinued in 2011. First production release of AutoCAD was in 1989. It was based on Interpress, an EDA tool kit that preceded the start of Autodesk and licensed to Interpress. The first AutoCAD release used the original name of Interpress. In 1991, Autodesk released AutoCAD 3D. Autodesk's first released software for building 3D models, AutoCAD 3D followed as an add-on to AutoCAD 2D. Part of Autodesk's AutoCAD 2D series of products, 2D-PLUS, was released in 1993. 2D-PLUS included improvements in various tools and drawing features. The name 2D-PLUS was a marketing name. In 1994, Autodesk released the first release of AutoCAD with the name AutoCAD. AutoCAD Architecture followed as a base model for AutoCAD Architecture, AutoCAD Electrical, AutoCAD Civil 3D, and AutoCAD Mechanical. AutoCAD is still available in a number of languages such as French, German, Japanese, Polish, Russian, and Spanish. Autodesk began shipping AutoCAD as a stand-alone application in 1998. An early launch of Autodesk's AutoCAD product was in 1990. The first version of AutoCAD, a two-dimensional drafting application, was based on Interpress. It was first released in 1989. CAD CAM was released in 1995 and discontinued in 2005. CAD CAM allowed a user to overlay the drawing onto a 3D model. In 1998, Autodesk released AutoCAD LT. AutoCAD LT is a free, open-source alternative to AutoCAD. The name AutoCAD is a common abbreviation of AutoCAD LT. AutoCAD LT was discontinued in 2015. The most recent AutoCAD release was in 2018.
